president's letter

At the start of this League year, I honestly didn't know what to expect as we were and still are living in an ever-changing world. The women of JLLC were finally back together and ready to grow and strengthen alongside our community. We were in a holding pattern long enough, so it didn't take long for our members to hit the ground running. We truly embraced our "Homegrown" theme and set out to help better our community and meet the needs of its' people. We definitely met some challenges along the way, but in true Junior League fashion, we met those challenges head on and found a way to make it all happen. The drive and spirit of our members and leaders is truly what made this League year a success.

Due to the outstanding work by the Management Team, especially our Fund Development and Communications Teams, the League showcased a concrete model for fundraising with a novel Public Relations plan. And for the first time, we had a Title Sponsor for all three of our fundraiser events and a League Corporate Champion Circle sponsor along with numerous different levels of sponsorships and donations. Mistletoe & Moss, Casino Night, and Touch-A-Truck were true success stories! All three committees poured their hearts into making these events truly memorable. All of their hard work and fundraising efforts allowed us to greatly increase our community involvement. We were able to put our Fit Kids program back in Oak Park and College Oaks. Read for the Record was back in 39 local schools, and we started Read for the Record Live this year. We purchase 214 Christmas gifts for Salvation Army Angels and gave away over 3.000 books to children in the five-parish region. Our Program Development Chair teamed up with Partners in Parks to create a free STEM activity for local children along with creating "Pause for the Cause" where we collected socks for the homeless and dental hygiene products for our youth. We prepared foster care bags and donated diapers to ABC Pregnancy Center. The Literacy committee purchased 10 new American Girl Dolls for our AGD Read to Your Doll program in our public library and are once again offering Literacy Nights with our local Head Start Schools. We distributed over 1,500 Touch-A-Truck tickets to CPSB schools, The Boys and Girls Club, St. Nicholas Center, and Harbor House. We donated 50 car seats and hosted a Click It or Ticket Car Seat Check. Our biggest gain came through our Snack Sacks program where we increased our distribution from 700 local students to 1,960! We are sponsoring the Kids Corner at This is Home Fest and donated \$10,000.00 to the CASA Program at Family & Youth. The list of this year's achievements really goes on and on and the vear isn't over vet.

As I begin to close out my year as President, I do it with a huge smile on my face and gratitude in my heart. Watching our members grow and develop as women and become more confident in what they are each capable of doing has truly been the best part of my JLLC career. I will forever be dedicated to our League and the women that inspire me every day.


Pirate's Pantry 45th Anniversary

Forty-five years ago, a dedicated group of women published this classic cookbook, which has become a staple in many homes in Louisiana and across the United States. I wonder if these ladies knew the impact that they would have when they were working on this book. The production of Pirate's Pantry represents three years of determination and hard work. The acknowledgments page at the front of this cookbook explains how these ladies had a dream. They worked tirelessly to compile the recipes that make up this classic cookbook. Each recipe was tested and edited to assure excellence and quality. Recipes were excluded, some were refined, and in the end, the final product was a well-rounded variety of excellent recipes. After three years of hard work, the cookbook was published. sold, and processed, benefiting the Junior League of Lake Charles. Forty-five years later, this book is still one of the top-selling Junior League cookbooks. Pirate's Pantry is rated among the country's top ten Junior League cookbooks. This cookbook has sold more than 100,000 copies since its first printing in 1976. The cookbook, published by Pelican Publishing, continues to support our community with the royalties received through sales. Forty-five years later, these ladies' dream is still impacting our community with the sales of these cookbooks. In honor of the 45th anniversary of Pirate's Pantry, they were available for purchase at Mistletoe and Moss this past November and sold out of 75 cookbooks. The Junior League Centennial Cookbook, a collection of recipes from 200 Junior Leagues, recently featured recipes from Pirate's Pantry.

ADDRESSING FOOD INSECURITY DURING SCHOOL BREAKS

Across Louisiana, programs provide free snacks and meals to low-income households throughout the community during after-school hours to reach and feed more children facing hunger and food insecurity. In recent years, the Junior League of Lake Charles has become more aware of the ever-growing need for additional food sustenance during holiday breaks. Since many children in our community qualify for free or reduced breakfast and lunch during the school time, what happens to those students during holiday breaks when they no longer have access to those meals?

Through our "Snack Sack" program, the Junior League of Lake Charles helps to provide children with a snack bag full of nutritious, child-friendly items to help curb their hunger during those long periods until they can receive those meals from school.

During Thanksgiving and Christmas breaks, Community Outreach was able to service four schools by giving out a total of almost 1,000 bags. For Easter, we were able to expand and provide snack sacks to five schools: Brentwood, JD Clifton , Combre-Fondel , Ralph Wilson and the newly added Pearl Watson Elementary.

In 2021-2022, the Community Outreach Committee will distribute more than 2,100 bags to schools across Calcasieu Parish over Thanksgiving, Christmas and Easter breaks.

SUSTAINING TWO LEGACY PROGRAMS

In 1970, the Junior League of Lake Charles established the Family & Youth Counseling Agency, whose mission is to provide affordable and professional support through programs and services dedicated to advocacy, counseling, and education for the people in Southwest Louisiana. In 1999, the Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA), a project of the League, became one of the divisions of Family & Youth.

CASA's mission is to advocate for children a part of the foster care system. The mission of CASA is for children in foster care to be placed in a safe and loving home. The impact these legacy programs have made on our community has been profound. This year we presented a \$10,000 donation to our Legacy program CASA, A Division of Family & Youth. The Junior League of Lake Charles will continue to strive to improve our community through effective action and leadership of trained volunteers.

The grant was enabled through the interest from a \$100,000 endowment that the Junior League of Lake Charles, Inc. established with the Community Foundation of Southwest Louisiana in 2019. Through this fund, which is administered by Community Foundation director/former JLLC president Sara Judson, the League can continue supporting its legacy programs without impacting cashflow or the operations of current JLLC projects.

IMPROVING THE COMMUNITY THROUGH EFFECTIVE ACTION

This year, we wanted to institute a few small projects that would coincide with the mission of JLLC by "improving the community through effective action". "Pause for a Cause" would take place at our General Meetings and allow the ladies of the league to give something small that would make a huge difference in the community we all hold near and dear to our hearts. It was decided that we would make three opportunities available this year.

In October, "Socktober" was implemented. Socks are one of the most sought-after items at homeless shelters during the winter months. We were able to collect over 250 pairs of socks. A small act of love, such as donating a pair of socks, can make a big difference in the lives of our neighbors who are homeless.

February is National Dental Hygiene Awareness month. With many residents unable to afford dental visits, it is important to raise the importance of good oral health. We collected and were able to provide toothbrushes and toothpaste to those individuals. All the items collected in October & February were donated to the Calcasieu Multipurpose Center to assist with their efforts to help our growing homeless population.

Our last "Pause for a Cause" will take place during our May General Meeting. Members will be encouraged to bring Menstrual Hygiene items (pads, tampons, & wipes) to help promote proper menstrual hygiene. For many young girls and women, it is a struggle to afford essential items needed during their menstrual cycle. Some young girls and women miss school or work due to not having the items they need monthly. By providing free pads & tampons, we help to improve the lives of impoverished females.

Let's continue to give small but make a BIG difference.

The Junior League of Lake Charles, Inc. was proud to participate again this year in the annual Read for the Record event. The Junior League of Lake Charles hosted the Touch-A-Truck event, presented by Bolton Ford. This event, formerly known as Truckfest, was rebranded to AJLI's global Touch-A-Truck event. It had to be canceled the past two years, so the return of this affordable family-friendly event was highly anticipated and larger than ever! It was held on the first Saturday of April at The Burton Coliseum, 9:00am to 4:00pm. A silent hour was held between 9:00 and 10:00am for children sensitive to loud sounds. This one-day event gave everyone in our community the opportunity to get an up-close look and interact with their favorite trucks and vehicles.

Touch-A-Truck included construction trucks, emergency response vehicles, community vehicles, and other fun novelty vehicles. This event also offered a variety of carnival games, community groups providing hands-on experiences, and entertainment from local groups and schools. This unique opportunity gave children and their families a chance to interact with these vehicles we so frequently see, but are unable to have access to. This day of fun and exploration gave participants a festival feel, creating lasting memories that SWLA has been craving.

A new addition to Touch-A-Truck was hosting a car seat check site. The Louisiana State Police Troop D, along with local CPST (Certified Passenger Safety Technician) volunteers were able to help 17 SWLA families with correctly installing car seats. JLLC also partnered with Healthy Blue to give away car seats to those requiring them.











Along with regular ticket presales, The Junior League of Lake Charles offered patrons the opportunity to "sponsor a classroom" ensuring that funds went directly to support classrooms in Title 1 schools.

With over 4,000 children and adults in attendance, Touch-A-Truck raised more than \$50,000, included 43 sponsors, over 70 vehicles, and 17 community groups.

Truck Fest planted the seeds for this event several years ago. this year Touch-A-Truck grew into an event that exceeded all of our expectations and goals. 
