Getting By

I'm not going to lie. I'm tired. Are you tired? I've been keeping a brave face on for so many months now, I can't remember not having to have it on. This isn't how it is supposed to be. Life is supposed to be a series: a challenge occurs, you put a brave face on and soldier on, the challenge passes, and you get back to normal. The challenge isn't supposed to last for months on end, then be supersized by two hurricanes.

Normally, I am writing about gratitude for this issue. After all, it is November – a time of cooler weather (finally), warmer clothes (finally, BOOTS!), pumpkin spice everything, and Thanksgiving. What's not to be grateful for? Well, this year I am struggling.

It's not that I'm not grateful. Things could be so much worse. Even the people I know who lost everything are trying to be grateful and telling themselves "things could be so much worse." We are all trying. We really are. It's just that the weight of slogging through the physical and emotional debris of the last couple of months, when we were already heavy with pandemic pandemonium is almost too much.

Almost. That is the key word here. When I work with clients who have chronic pain issues, we use the word "almost" a lot. "It's almost too much to bear." "You almost don't want to be here anymore if you have to live like this." The word "almost" gives us a way to acknowledge the depth of our emotions without being final. The word "almost" also reminds us that we can still carry on. If it were truly too much, we wouldn't be here any longer. But we are still here. Putting one foot buried in concrete blocks in front of the other.

I want to share with you the things I have been doing to help me get through these trying times. These are the things I do regularly because I have found them to be helpful and comforting.

Exercise. I must have walked a million miles in the last nine months. Prior to the pandemic, I worked out at a gym. When the gyms were closed, I rediscovered walking, which I had always loved many years ago. I had stopped walking, and started other forms of cardio, because I wanted to burn more calories. I forgot how much I love walking: being outside, using all 5 senses while walking, and letting my brain process and problem solve. I don't see me giving this up (and I don't think my dog will let me).

Yoga. I decided to try yoga during the pandemic. I had always heard about it, read about the benefits, and goodness knows, I needed something to help me calm down! I was never very interested in it because I was exercising in other ways and practicing mindfulness in other ways. Well, I have drunk the Yoga Koolaid. I'm a true believer now. I had no idea how much all my muscles needed to stretch. I had convinced myself that "everything hurting" when I get up in the mornings is a result of all that exercise and is normal. Now I know it doesn't have to be that way. A friend turned me on to Yoga With Adriene on YouTube. She is so calming, positive and relaxing. She doesn't know it, but she's my friend.

Podcasts. I know I'm late to the party with this one. I have always been a "book on CD" girl, and was constantly at the library checking them out. I know there are a million podcast options out there, but I have a few favorites for you to consider:

Della Krause Thielen Voluntarism Award - Mrs. Pearl Cole

Since 1994, the Della Krause Thielen Voluntarism Award has been given to honor an individual's or organization's exceptional and sustained contributions through voluntarism in one or all of the following: a variety of community service, outstanding leadership, effectiveness of community service, tenure of community service and perseverance in accomplishing an outstanding project. The award, established by Della K. Thielen's family and administered through the Junior League of Lake Charles, Inc, embodies Mrs. Theilen's own outstanding commitment to voluntarism.

The 2020 award winner is Mrs. Pearl Cole, the face and heart of Abraham's Tent. Mrs. Cole has been involved with the organization since its inception in 1986. She grew up in Kinder, LA and was 1 of 5 children. She was raised with a large family and taught her a sense of family.

Prior to her role at Abraham's Tent, she volunteered at her church, Immaculate Heart of Mary. She saw the needy come and knock on the door seeking assistance. This prompted her to take action. Soon after she worked for the Diocese of Lake Charles, which was instrumental in the formation of Abraham's Tent. She volunteered at the center for 3 years and later became the Director, where she continues to serve. Each day the center (Abraham's Tent) serves hot lunches to the disadvantaged. Prior to Covid, the center served over 400 meals per day.

Her philosophy is God has given each of us a life with a purpose. She knew this from a very young age and believes that God will take care of you if you accept what he has given to you, that calling. Her goal is to make a difference in the lives of others. She has been quoted to say, "The need is real. All are welcomed and no one is turned away."

2019-2020 Outstanding Active Service Award - Mrs. Elise Foret

Each year the Junior League of Lake Charles awards the Outstanding Active Service Award to an exceptional member who, during her time in our League, has exceeded expectations and left a lasting impression.

The common thread among other members' impression of her is that she is always willing to do the hard work with a small on her face. She is the epitome of today's southern lady: kind, generous, thoughtful, and happy to help out in any situation.

What some of our members had to say about Elise:

"In her placement this year (and every other year) she exceeded all expectations of the position by doing her duties far beyond to make it a success. This has been the case with all of her previous positions as well. She sees a problem, shortcoming, or need and without hesitation fills the gap to bring success to whatever she touches."

I learned that she is organized, kind, conscientious, driven, and a leader. I learned all this about her without ever meeting her. Let's just say that I became an instant admirer comparable to a Backstreet Boys fan. When I finally met her in person and thanked her, she responded with humility. She thanked me for the compliment and offered her encouragement and assistance, should I need it. She is humble. She is a true woman of service and she cares about supporting other women."

She has served on both the Community and Finance Councils in the League; twice on Healthy Choices committee, once on Truck Fest, and 2020 is her 7th year on Mistletoe & Moss; including chairing Decorations, Donations, and Finance. She still has more to give to the League and continues on in her second year as an Extender.

Additionally, this wonder woman shares her gifts with her children's school serving on the auction committee and as a room mom. She is also part of the Calcasieu Medical Society Alliance.

Her husband had this to say, "I feel like she has really enjoyed her years in the Junior League. She has enjoyed the camaraderie of other women and working on projects to reach a common goal. Mistletoe & Moss was probably her favorite where she exercised leadership and teamwork within the committee. She is a great planner and organizer; completing all these projects, all while taking care of 3 school children and a busy household. I am very proud of the things she has done, giving her time to community outreach projects and making a real difference in many lives.

AUGUST 2020 Women's Vote Matters

The right of citizens of the United States to vote shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or by any State on account of sex.

THE NINETEENTH AMENDMENT

In August, JLLC recognized the 100th anniversary of when the United States Congress ratified the 19th Amendment to the Constitution, granting women the right to vote. Today, more than 68 million women vote in elections because of the courageous suffragists who never gave up the fight for equality.

It is critical to note that not all women were included in this historical moment. Women of Color were excluded and denied this core pillar of our democracy until August 6, 1965 with the passage of the Voting Rights Act. As an organization that develops women, all women, it is incumbent upon us as civic leaders to acknowledge this fact and understand the wider story surrounding the fight for suffrage in the United States.
